Discussion by social work experts

The third Tuesday in March is traditionally devoted to World Social Work Day. From behind the organization of this important day is IFSW, which on March 15, 2022 announced its 15th year. This year's IFSW initiative to celebrate World Social Work Day was on the theme: "Co-building a New Eco-social World: Leaving No One Behind". On the occasion of World Social Work Day, the Department of Social Services and Counselling FSV UCM in Trnava, on March 15, 2022, organized an event entitled "WORLD COFFEE WITH FSV UCM IN TRNAVA".
